REMINDER *** REMINDER *** REMINDER MINING CLAIM AND SITE FILING REQUIREMENTS FOR 2020 *** NEW FEES ***

If you hold unpatented mining claims or sites on Federal lands, your annual maintenance fee payments or maintenance fee waiver certification, Form 3830-2 (waiver), must be filed with the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) State Office of the State where your claims or sites are located. The **Utah State Office address is above.**

The 2020 maintenance fee document with fees or waiver are due on or before September 3, 2019 (September 1 is a Sunday and September 2 is a Federal holiday). If the filing is received after September 3rd, then the envelope containing the filing must have a readable postmark of on or before the due date of September 1, 2019. Failure to timely pay the fee or file the waiver in the proper BLM office, will subject your claims or sites to forfeiture by operation of law.

A final rule was published in the Federal Register on July 1, 2019, 84 FR 31219, which increased the location and maintenance fees due for mining claims and sites recorded with the BLM. These increases are in effect starting with the 2020 assessment year.

The maintenance fees for a lode claim, mill site or tunnel site are now \$165 per claim or site. The fee for placer claims is \$165 for each 20 acres of the claim or portion thereof.

If you have already timely paid your maintenance fee for the 2020 assessment year to the BLM at the old rate (\$155), please submit the additional fee; otherwise you will receive written notice from the BLM that you must pay the additional amount within 30 days of your receipt of BLM's notice. Failure to submit the additional fee will result in your claims or sites to be forfeited.

Conveniently pay your maintenance fee online. You may pay your maintenance fee with a credit card, debit card or ACH payment online (except for claims or sites in Alaska) at https://payp.blm.gov. Payments made online must be made on or before midnight, September 3, 2019, Eastern Daylight Time. If paying online, there is no need to send any notification to the BLM State Office that manages your claims or sites. Treasury limits apply to credit card payments and the current Treasury limit for credit card payments is \$24,999.99. Even though there are no Treasury limits for debit card or ACH payments, you should contact your bank to verify any restrictions they may have for such payments. During the process of paying for your claims or sites online, you will have the opportunity to print a receipt of your order; please take

that opportunity to print your receipt showing the claims and sites for which you have paid. After you complete your transaction you will receive confirmation of your payment, and the BLM State Office where your claims or sites are recorded will have a receipt of the transaction. Five days after you make your payment, you can also verify that your payment was recorded by running a report of your claims or sites at http://www.blm.gov/lr2000.

• Waiver Requirements: You may file the waiver if you and all related parties own 10 or fewer claims or sites nationwide on September 1, 2019. BLM Form 3830-2 (attached) must be used and must contain original signatures of each owner and include their current mailing address. If an agent signs the waiver on your behalf, you must have a current notarized designation that the agent is authorized to sign on your behalf. This designation should be submitted with your waiver if not already on file with the BLM, or if the one on file with the BLM is over 3 years old. There is no processing fee when filing the waiver. Faxed or emailed waivers are not acceptable and will be returned unrecorded.

FLPMA Document Filings: If you filed a waiver for the 2019 assessment year, you must also file the following on or before December 30, 2019, to complete that filing:

- For placer or lode claims, an affidavit of assessment work (proof of labor) attesting that you performed at least \$100 worth of labor to make improvements on each of your claims, during the 2019 assessment year, along with a \$15 processing fee for each claim; or
- For mill sites and tunnel sites, a notice of intent to hold, along with a \$15 processing fee for each site.

Forms can be found online at https://www.blm.gov/services/electronic-forms. It is highly recommended that your proof of labor or notice of intent to hold, along with your processing fee, be submitted at the same time your waiver is filed.

Notice to Claimant

MAINTENANCE FEE--INCREASED TO \$165 IN EFFECT FOR THE 2020 FILING YEAR, WHICH IS DUE ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1, 2019.

For lode claims, mill sites and tunnel sites: annual maintenance fee is \$165 for each claim/site.

For placer claims: the annual maintenance fee is \$165 for each 20 acres of the placer claim or portion thereof.

If the claimant paid the \$155 fee for each claim/site for the 2020 filing year, then the additional \$10 fee must be submitted.

LOCATION FEE INCREASED TO \$40.

Notice of Location (NOL) recordation fee:

With date of location <u>prior to</u> September 1, 2019, \$212 per claim/site fee is required at the time of recordation with BLM. This fee covers--\$20 nonrefundable processing fee, \$37 location fee, and the \$155 maintenance fee for the assessment year in which the claim/site is located.

With date of location on or after September 1, 2019, \$225 per claim/site fee is required at the time of recordation with BLM. This fee covers--\$20 nonrefundable processing fee, \$40 location fee, and the \$165 maintenance fee for the assessment year in which the claim/site is located.

(For placer claims, the maintenance fee is paid for each 20 acres of the placer claim or portion thereof.)

PROCESSING FEE INCREASED TO \$15.

The processing fee for a proof of labor, notice of intent to hold, transfer document and amended notice of location were increased to \$15 per claim or site effective October 1, 2018.





WAIVER CERTIFICATION FILING—UTAH CLAIM/SITE

If you do not qualify for a waiver of the maintenance fee—then you must pay the annual maintenance fee on or before the due date. If you apply for the waiver and you exceed the 10 claim limit, your claims may be forfeited for failure to pay the fee.

If you qualify for the <u>WAIVER</u>, the <u>CERTIFICATION</u>, <u>BLM Form 3830-2</u>, must be filed with the <u>BLM on or before September 1st</u> and is filed for the upcoming assessment year. No fee is required when filing the waiver with the BLM. To qualify for a small miner waiver, all claimants must have 10 or less claims and claimant must complete the assessment work for the following assessment years:

- 1. The assessment year prior to the assessment year that you are applying for the waiver (current year); and
- 2. The assessment year that the maintenance fee is waived (upcoming year).

See Regulations 43 CFR 3835 for maintenance fee waiver qualifications and other exceptions.



The Individual signing on behalf of a company, etc., must have signing authority, please submit signing authority document along with the waiver certification. Must submit current document every 3 years.



If a claimant that is applying for a waiver has transferred or wishes to relinquish (abandon) some claims, the transfer or relinquishment documents must be effective or filed prior to September 1st.

Notification Prior to Conducting Surface Disturbing Activities on your Mining Claim

The filling of your claim/site with the Utah State Office of the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) does not convey an authorization to conduct operations (explore, develop, occupy or mine) on your claim/site. You must first contact the Federal agency which administers the surface and mineral estate and follow their agency's regulations before conducting any surface disturbing activities.

A plan of operations is also required for any operation other than casual use in the following special status areas: (1) lands in the California Desert Conservation Area (CDCA) designated by CDCA plan as "controlled" or "limited" use areas, (2) area in the National Wild and Scenic Rivers System and areas designated for potential addition to the system; (3) designated Areas of Critical Environmental Concern; (4) areas designated as part of the National Wilderness Preservation System and administered by BLM; (5) areas designated as closed to offroad vehicle use as defined in 43 CFR 8340.0-5; (6) any lands or waters known to contain Federally proposed or listed threatened or endangered species or their proposed or designated critical habitat, unless BLM allows for other action under a formal land-use plan or threatened or endangered species recovery plan; and (7) National Monuments and National Conservation Areas administered by BLM.
